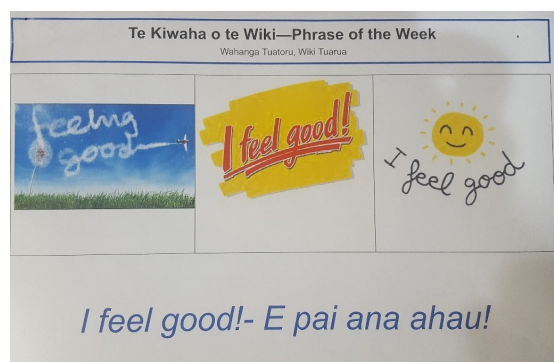
**TIME SPENT BUILDING
